However submitters are strongly encouraged to contact the program co-chairs at ches2014programchairs@iacr.org in advance of this deadline to discuss and coordinate their proposal.

Tutorial proposals should provide the following information as a single-page pdf file:

- Tutorial title
- Presenter list, indicating contact details
- Description of tutorial contents, level, duration, and intended audience (up to 500 words)
- Description of any special equipment or A/V requirements

The presenters of tutorials at CHES 2014 will receive complementary conference registration. They will also be eligible for a fixed stipend that can be used towards their travel expenses.
